

ACTIVITY I: Haiku Poem

A Haiku is a traditional form of Japanese Poetry. The poem has only three lines. The first line has 5 syllables in it. The second line has 7 syllables and the third line has 5 syllables again. The poem is usually about a single thing, such as nature, an animal, a season, etc. Here are some examples of Haiku Poems.



Can you write your own Haiku poem? Give it a try. It can be on anything such as your pet, your favorite fruit, your favorite tree, etc.

(Line 1: 5 syllables)

(Line 2: 7 syllables)

(Line 3: 5 syllables)

Activity II: Acrostic Poem

Acrostic poems are fun to write. It can be about anything, it doesn't have to rhyme and a line can be have a few words or even just one word. There is something you need to know about them. The first letter in each line spell out a word. For example:
