Read the book, The Biggest Valentine Ever by Steven Kroll or in YouTube and make a special Valentine for someone special today!




Palau Day.


This month's lesson is on Library Books Organization.

Libraries have thousands and thousands of books. How would you know where to find a book on the shelf? Books in libraries are organized in a special way.


If you remember from the library lessons we learned in school, the fiction books are shelved in order by the author's last name, and the non-fiction books use a system called the Dewey Decimal Classification System. These books are categorized by subject using a number category and the author's last name.

It is very important that we master our alphabets and numbers so we are able to find these books on the book shelves.

LET'S ORGANIZE YOUR HOME LIBRARY

- **Step 1:** Gather your books around your house.
- Step 2: Separate your books in two stacks: Fiction and Non-Fiction
- Step 3: Alphabetize your fiction books by the author's last name.
- Step 4: Place the fiction books on the shelf by the author's last name.

YOU ARE DONE WITH THE FICTION BOOKS

Step 5: If you have non-fiction books, separate them by categories: for example, put the animal books together, the science books together, the sports books together. Etc.

- **Step 6:** Alphabetize the animal books by the author's last name for each category.
- **Step 7:** Place them on the shelf and separated by category.
- YOU CAN ALSO KEEP TRACK OF YOUR BOOKS BY MAKING A LIST OF ALL OF THEM. IF SOMEONE WANTS TO BORROW A BOOK, YOU KNOW EXACTLY WHAT YOU HAVE ON YOUR SHELF AND WHERE IS IT IS. YOU CAN ALSO MAKE YOUR OWN SYSTEM TO CHECK-OUT AND CHECK-IN.
